This reminds me of how my family and I escaped war in Eritrea and had to flee to save our lives. We sought asylum in Ethiopia when I was ten years old, where we lived in a refugee camp for about five years before moving to the United States. In each of my interactions with planes, I remember saying confidently, "One day, I will be the person flying this."

My personal story heavily resonates with the mission of RTH. As an underrepresented pilot, it is important that, like Jasper Harris, Jr., I am reminded of my legacy, which is what motivates me to break barriers. English was an unfamiliar language, and communication was very hard for my family as we grew into our new life in the United States. Yet, even at an early age, I understood the level of sacrifice my parents made for me to have a better future, and I knew that education would be the catalyst for my successful future ahead.
